

Excerpts from The Roman Missal



Excerpts from the Roman Missal has been long awaited. For priests, it serves as an alternative to the *Roman Missal* at the Presider's Chair. It is light, smaller in thickness than the *Order of Christian Funerals* and the same dimensions as other ritual books published by CCCB Publications.

The print contrast has been improved from the *Roman Missal* and the font is substantially larger than the Chapel edition. Another great addition to this publication is the inclusion of options for the third form of the Penitential Act.


Eucharistic Prayers for Masses with Children



The General Instruction of the Roman Missal



The General Instruction of the Roman Missal is the foundational document for understanding the new *Roman Missal*. It is an essential tool for all who are involved in preparing or serving at the liturgy of the Eucharist. It is included in the new Roman Missal but is available in an identical format to use in study groups and for quick reference.


Ordo / Liturgical Calendar



The *ORDO*, or Liturgical Calendar, is an essential tool for bishops, priests, deacons, religious, parish staff and volunteers, liturgy committees, and school staff.

The *ORDO* provides detailed information and explanatory notes for each day of the Liturgical Year which begins the First Sunday of Advent and ends with the 34th Week in Ordinary time. In addition to the references to the *Roman Missal*, the Lectionary (for Sundays, Solemnities and Weekdays) and *Liturgy of the Hours*, references to the *Book of Gospels* and the *Lectionary: Ritual Masses, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses, Masses for the Dead* are also included.


Sourcebook


LECTIONARIES


Weekdays / A / B



The Weekday Lectionary comes in two volumes. Each volume includes the ferial and sanctoral readings. Volume A covers Advent to Pentecost; Volume B covers Ordinary Time (May to November). The readings for Ordinary Time are placed in separate sections for Years I and II.

Ritual & Votive Masses




Essential for every church and chapel and a distinct colour to help distinguish it from other volumes of the Lectionary! This newest volume contains passages from the NRSV version of Sacred Scripture, approved for use in Canada for a multitude of occasions and celebrations.

There are sections containing celebrations pertaining to any Sacrament, Ritual and Special Occasion being celebrated outside of Sunday Mass. It also includes a new expanded selection of readings for Funeral Liturgies and Masses for the Dead (approved by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments) for use in Canada.

The section on "Masses for Various Needs and Occasions" provides a multitude of suggestions for a wide variety of situations pertaining to Church life; Civic Needs; Public Needs including For the Blessing of Human Labour, In Time of Famine, For the Sick, and In Thanksgiving to God; to name a few! There are also numerous selections for Votive Masses.

PSALMS


Year A



A publication composed of Psalm Settings for the NRSV Psalms, coinciding with the Canadian Edition of the *Lectioary, Sundays and Solemnities*.

Most of the settings were composed by Canadian composers. There is a generous selection of Psalms for each Sunday, solemnity and even Common "Seasonal Psalms". The book is designed to enable cantors and assemblies to sing the Responsorial Psalm during Sunday Mass and Solemnities as simply as possible. Each book is divided into two sections, the first for musicians/cantors contains the entire Psalm (refrain, verses and complete music); the second contains the refrain with music for the assembly.



Each publication includes:


- For musicians: complete music for keyboard and guitar
- For cantors: complete music for refrains and verse tones
- For the assembly: accessible melodies for the refrain
- Copyright permissions: Both the music for the musicians /cantors and that for the assembly can be copied (or projected)

 - PDF files for easy duplication (up to a maximum number of copies without having to seek copyright permission) or projection
 - MP3 files with a sample of the refrain and verses (music and cantor)


The Order of Celebrating Matrimony



The Order of Celebrating Matrimony for use in Canada is a translation of the Second Edition of the Latin *Ordo celebrandi Matrimonium* of 1991. "It is the sole English-language translation and version hereby permitted for use in the Dioceses of Canada immediately upon publication. Its use is mandatory beginning September 8, 2017."

There are a number of substantial changes from the original 1969 edition. This latest edition has an expanded *Praenotanda* (Introduction) which expands upon the Church's theology of Marriage.


The Order of Celebrating Matrimony / Liturgy Planning Guide


FUNERALS

Order of Christian Funerals



This ritual book contains the complete Funeral Rites for Adults and for Children including: Vigils and Related Rites and Prayers; the Funeral Mass; the Funeral Liturgy outside of Mass; and the Committal. This newest version of the *Order of Christian Funerals* (Canadian edition) has been updated to include the revised texts from the *Roman Missal*, the NRSV texts of the Scriptures and new musical Psalm settings set to the NRSV Psalms (contained in the new *Psalms for Sundays and Solemnities* series). Each book also contains a separate laminated card with the "Short Rite of Committal" for use in inclement weather.

Order of Christian Funerals: Supplement for Celebrations with Cremated Remains



This Supplement to the *Order of Christian Funerals* is intended to meet the current pastoral and liturgical needs in Canada given the frequency of those choosing cremation for their departed loved ones both before and after the Funeral Liturgy.


Funeral Resource: Sacred Scripture Selections for a Funeral Liturgy


OTHER IMPORTANT BOOKS

Rite of Baptism for Children



This Canadian edition provides the complete rites for celebrating baptism within Mass and in Sunday celebrations in the absence of a priest, the rite of welcome for an adopted child who is baptized, the expanded models for general intercessions, the complete lectionary texts for baptism, pastoral notes, and the *Instruction on Infant Baptism*.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults




This Canadian edition includes a 40-page section of other rites for use in Canada. These provide a full set of celebrations for baptized Catholics preparing for confirmation and Eucharist, and for Christians coming into the full communion of the Catholic Church. Parallel to the rites of the catechumenate for the unbaptized, these celebrations respect the baptismal dignity of the candidates and meet the pastoral needs of Canadian communities. Pastors, catechists, and others involved in leading the catechumenate will benefit from this book in preparing and celebrating liturgies.

The Order of Confirmation




This new publication of the *Order of Confirmation* is the second official English translation of the liturgical texts for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is the first of the retranslated liturgical books expected to be promulgated in the next few years. This revision follows the request of the Holy See in 2002 to review and retranslate all the liturgical books. The guidelines provided in *Liturgiam Authenticam* ensure a translation that follows the original Latin text more closely so that its full meaning may be better appreciated. At the request of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, this new ritual book follows the content and structure of the *Ordo Confirmationis*. This is the "sole English-language translation that is approved for use in the Dioceses of Canada, beginning on the Solemnity of All Saints, November 1, 2016."

Sunday Celebration of the Word and Hours




The ritual for *Sunday Celebration of the Word and Hours* is intended for liturgical assemblies where the Eucharist cannot be celebrated. The ritual book can also be used on other occasions: parish or community celebrations of Morning or Evening Prayer; liturgies of the Word in chapels and institutions where it is not pastorally possible to celebrate the Eucharist; or ecumenical celebrations of the Word or Hours. Pastoral notes for the celebration of the Word and Hours are contained in two separate publications. The Liturgical Notes, which are printed in the ritual book itself, concern the actual celebration and its preparation.

Blessings and Prayers for Home and Family





Celebrations of Installation and Recognition



A handsomely bound, user-friendly, 372-page book, *Celebrations of Installation and Recognition* is a unique and comprehensive resource and commissioning tool for bishops, pastors, parish administrators and coordinators of the various diocesan and parish ministries. Written in response to a need frequently expressed in parishes and dioceses across Canada, it provides celebrations for installing a pastor or a parish administrator, and for recognizing all those who serve in the various ministries of the Christian community. These celebrations of installation and recognition may be celebrated by the parish community within the Mass, or in the context of a Liturgy of the Word or the Liturgy of the Hours.

Children's Liturgy: Guidelines



Drawing inspiration from the *Directory for Masses with Children*, this user-friendly book offers guidelines for celebrating the liturgy of the word with children during Sunday Mass. It provides practical assistance to all those involved in the important ministry of planning and leading the liturgy where children are present.


